Independence

At this point in the year, we would like to encourage our children to become as independent as possible. Please could we ask that your child comes into school by themselves, saying goodbye to them in the yard if not coming to school by bus. This encourages children to be more independent and reduces the number of adults in the school on a morning, which supports us with safeguarding. Of course, if a parent needs to speak to an adult, this opportunity will be still be available.

Children in KS2 have a planner to help them organise their equipment and kits each day as this would be the expectation in middle school and high school. It supports their transition. Please encourage your child to check them daily to organise themselves for the week.

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Summer Term Assessments

During the Summer Term, summative assessments do take place. Children are required to be in school for these assessments and therefore leave of absence will not be authorised during a testing period. Year 1 phonics test will take place week beginning 11th June. Year 2 assessment tests in mathematics and reading will take place in May. Results of the test will be reported to parents along with their end of year report.

Supporting your child at home

Please may we encourage all parents to read with their child every day. Last term we noticed a significant number of children were not reading at home for significant periods of time. Children progress much more quickly with their reading when they have regular daily opportunities to read at home and at school. If children wish to read other texts at home other than their school books, this should also be recorded in their reading record books by an adult. Even children who can read independently, benefit greatly from reading aloud to practise intonation and expression. In depth discussions about stories with parents, support children's comprehension skills as well as develop pleasure in reading. Please help us to foster a positive reading habit with our children.


Many of the terms we now teach children in our grammar and punctuation lessons are unfamiliar to those who were not taught grammar at school. Such terms as adverb, adjective, clause, sub-ordinate clause, conjunctions and parenthesis become common for the children as they progress through school.
