Y2 assessments

We would like to invite parents with a child in Year 2, to a meeting to discuss the end of Y2 assessments. These assessments will take place in May and outcomes will be reported in their end of year reports. The meeting will be an opportunity to discuss national expectations and see examples of test papers and ask any questions. The meeting will take place at 3pm on Wednesday 1^{st} March in Mrs. Morris' room.

Phonics and Reading

At Swarland Primary School we would like all children to read every day to an adult. When children come to unknown words they are encouraged to sound them out to decode them. It is crucial that children are articulating the sounds correctly. Often children will pronounce 'm' as 'muh' or 's' as 'suh'. In order to clarify how the sounds should be articulated and enable to provide further support for your child at home, please take the time to watch the short one minute video link which demonstrates the articulation of sounds. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BahXUW v-1s

Please encourage your child to read to an adult at home each day and record their reading in their reading record books.

Congratulations to the Duchess High School, Alnwick

Our feeder high school is among the top 10 secondary schools in the North East. The Duchess's Community High School is ranked at ninth in the top state secondary schools in the region as part of the annual Sunday Times Parent Power, published in The Sunday Times. The guide, which can be found at http://www.thesundaytimes.co.uk/parentpower contains the top 2,000 state and independent schools, ranked by their latest academic results, and searchable by postcode, town, local authority and name of school. It says the percentage of Duchess's pupils gaining A* to B at A-Level last summer was 54.6%, with 20% notched up an A* or A at GCSE. In tenth spot is King Edward VI School in Morpeth, with 52.7% pupils gaining A* to B at A-Level.

















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Go Smarter Parker
